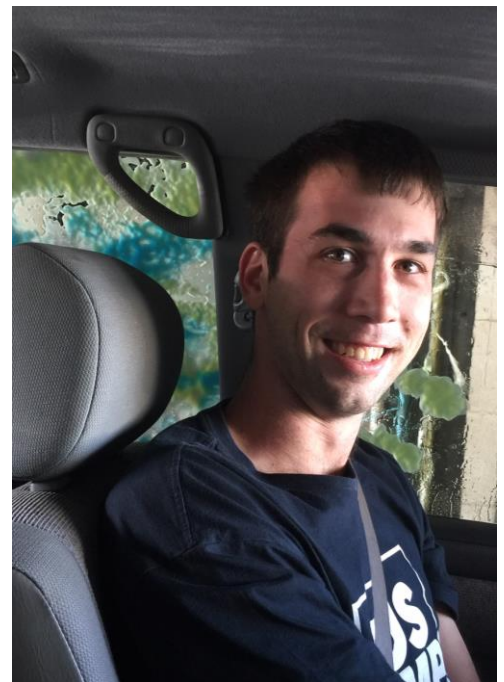

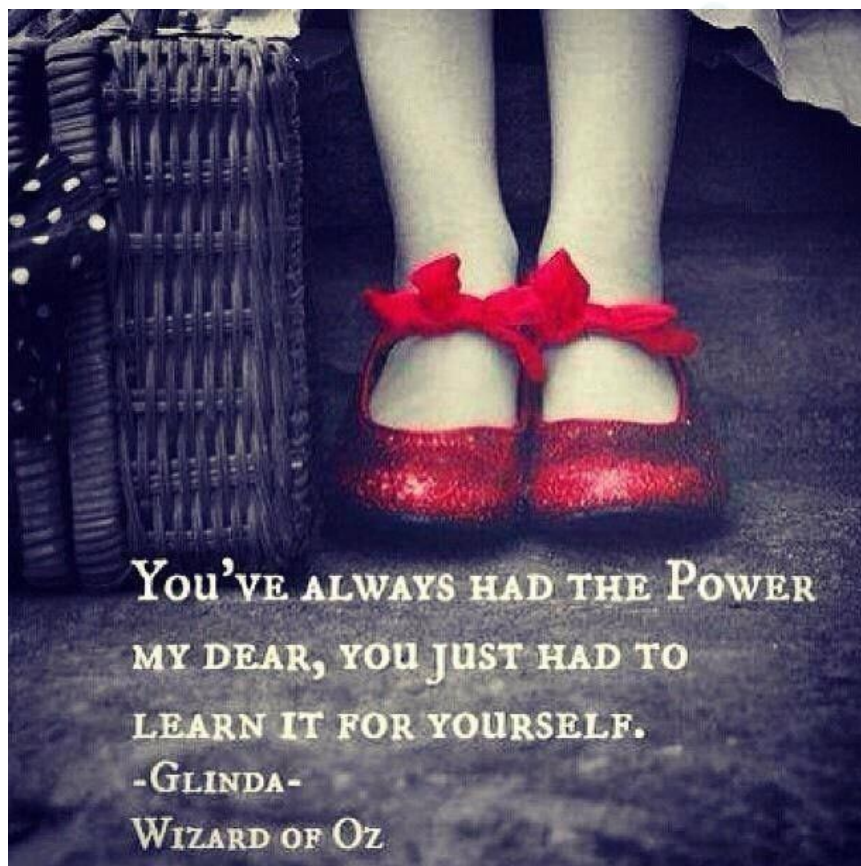

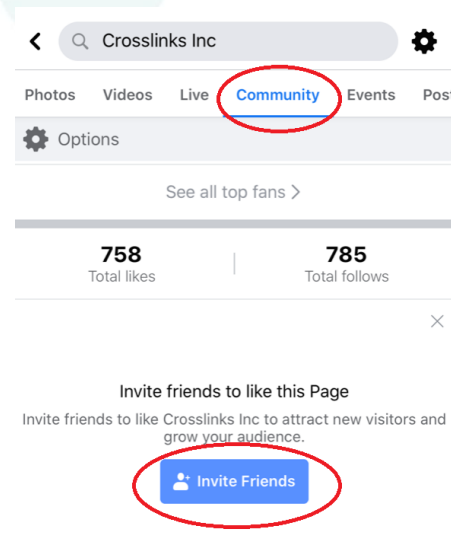

### Peter's Big Boy Toys

On the 7<sup>th</sup> of August Peter and I went to the RAAFA Aviation Heritage Museum. As you walk in, it can be a little overwhelming, the first thing you notice is just how big everything is. The first plane to stand out is the PBY-5A Catalina, with an official wingspan of nearly 32m this WW2 monster almost stretches the entire width of the hanger. (As I am writing this and inserting the Photos, I will point out that the pictures do not do these planes justice and do not look as overwhelming as seeing it in person).

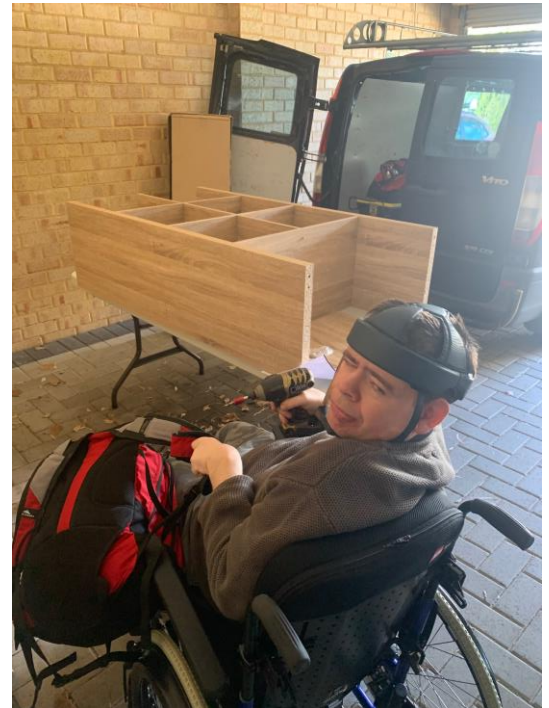
### ***The Roberts Reporter August 2020***

As things return to the new normal here at Roberts. Luke and Glenn have been getting organised.

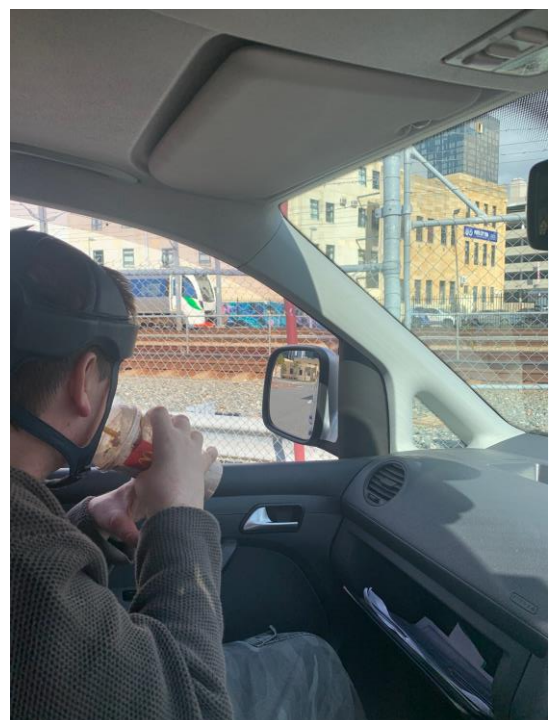
