

Peter's Big Boy Toys

On the 7th of August Peter and I went to the RAAFA Aviation Heritage Museum. As you walk in, it can be a little overwhelming, the first thing you notice is just how big everything is. The first plane to stand out is the PBY-5A Catalina, with an official wingspan of nearly 32m this WW2 monster almost stretches the entire width of the hanger. (As I am writing this and inserting the Photos, I will point out that the pictures do not do these planes justice and do not look as overwhelming as seeing it in person).

Prior to being purchased this Catalina was used to advertise a Texan (USA) restaurant. The Western Australian Government provided the fund and It was bought by the Australia American Catalina Foundation and restored by 2 Texan's before being shipped to Perth.

As it happened the kind volunteer's name was also Peter (Peter Tickner). I asked Peter T if he had a spare 5-10 minutes to show Peter L the more interesting things in the museum. 
Luke got organised via some new furniture, a beautiful solid marri chest of drawers and a storage unit that came flat packed.
